WELCOME OUR NEW TPD DISTRICT 2 MAJOR: LESLIE RICHARDSON

Major Les Richardson II is a devoted public servant in the law enforcement profession, boasting an exceptional career of over two decades. Born and raised on St. Thomas, U.S. Virgin Islands, he attended Delaware State University on a music scholarship, earning dual bachelor's degrees in criminal justice and sociology.

Prior to joining the Tampa Police Department in 2001, Major Richardson gained valuable experience working in juvenile probation. Major Richardson started his TPD tenure in patrol, but has since worked a range of assignments, including narcotics investigations, gang unit operations, and school resource officer duties.

At each level in his career, Major Richardson has prioritized professional development, community engagement, and relationship-building. He is a graduate of the International Association of Chiefs of Police (IACP) Leadership in Police Organizations program and the University of Chicago School of Public Policy Policing Leadership Academy. NEIGHBORHOOD EFFORTS LEAD TO IMPORTANT VICTORY AGAINST PLAYERS CLUB

A big thank you goes out to our dedicated neighbors, TPD, and Code Enforcement for their relentless efforts in addressing violations at Players Club, which opened earlier this year on Hillsborough Avenue. Players Club was operating as a late night strip club, with loud music, and activities they were not zoned for. After the issues were mentioned on Facebook, Neighborhood Watch leaders Brian D. Frey and Bill Truett coordinated closely with TPD and Code Enforcement to eventually bring this case up for a special hearing.

During the hearing, City of Tampa Code Enforcement officer, Ryan Shepherd, presented evidence of illegal activities at the club, including advertising full nude dancers and private rooms. Our neighbors filled the hearing room, with many getting up to speak against the business. Despite the owner's claims of ignorance and compliance, the magistrate found the business in violation of local codes, giving them until August 21st to correct the issues or face fines.

Thanks to these collective efforts, we can now confirm that the business has ceased operations, and the space is up for lease. This is a significant win for our neighborhood, and we are grateful to everyone who contributed to this outcome.



Celebrating Festive Traditions in Hampton Terrace

This year, we celebrate the 100th anniversary of Lakewood Manor, now known as Hampton Terrace. The neighborhood's development began in late 1924, with the creation of Lake Hampton, which was later renamed Lake Roberta after Roberta, the daughter of one of our community's developers, Lillian Probasco.

The holiday spirit in Hampton Terrace has deep roots, beginning in 1935 when the Lakewood Manor Garden Club introduced the first holiday float to Lake Roberta. Despite its initial destruction after Christmas, the float made a triumphant return in 1938. By 1950, the Lakewood Manor Civic Club had perfected the tradition, winning first place in the civic club division of the Junior Chamber of Commerce Brighten Up Contest. The below image from The Tampa Tribune captures the award-winning float.

The 1950s were a golden era for holiday celebrations in Hampton Terrace. The neighborhood became a festive hub, with the famous "Santa Float" and beautifully decorated houses drawing crowds from all over Tampa. The streets were packed every night during the holidays, with cars lined up bumper to bumper as people flocked to see the sights. The Tampa Police Department had to direct traffic from Hillsborough Avenue and Nebraska Avenue to the entrance of Lake Roberta to manage the influx of visitors.

After touring the neighborhood, families would drive up to Holsum Bakery (where Walgreens now stands at Hillsborough Avenue and 22nd Avenue) to see Santa Claus and receive a special gift bag, which usually included a tangerine, candy cane, and pencil.

The mother of current resident, Susan Dining Lane, or as many refer to her "Nana" even won a prize from the Chamber of Commerce for having the first flocked Christmas tree in Tampa.





Though some traditions, like the house decorating contest, have faded, the legacy of the float lives on, thanks to the efforts of our community members and the Hampton Terrace Neighborhood Association.

This spirit of togetherness is also reflected in other beloved holiday traditions, such as our Christmas Eve Luminaries, which began around Lake Roberta and now light up much of the neighborhood, and the HTCA's festive entrance median decorations. These traditions, both old and new, have brought joy to countless people over the years and continue to be a cherished part of our neighborhood's history.
